

Causal conjunctions show **cause and effect**. They explain **why something happens** or **what happens as a result**.

Examples:

- I stayed inside **because** it was raining.
- She was tired, **so** she went to bed early.

Causal Conjunction Examples

because as as a result so consequently hence
therefore since even though due to the fact
